The international conference "Theories and Practices of Care: International Comparisons" aims to shed new light on the meanings, practices and policies of care as work. This practical, technical and emotional work is shaped by social relations of gender, class and "race"/ethnicity, between the variety of stakeholders involved: providers and recipients of care, as well as those who manage, supervise or prescribe care work. Care refers not only to a caring attitude; it is a type of work that covers a whole range of practical activities and relationships, that seek to provide concrete solutions to the needs of others. Care can also be defined as a relationship of service, support and assistance, paid or unpaid, involving a sense of responsibility towards the life and well-being of others.

The aim of this conference is to bring

together researchers and practitioners, to allow them to share their experiences and present the reality of care work in various countries. To this end, this event is organized by the international network MAGE (Marché du travail et genre), which is comprised of researchers and academics from France and abroad; "Agir pour le care", part of the Humanis group, which brings together researchers and practitioners, from within or outside of institutions, in the field of care work, especially care for the elderly and the disabled; as well as the GTM Cresppa research lab, which focuses on issues of labor, gender and citizenship.


